Students who feel rather strongly that US students wouldn't be surprised by a lecturer (n=98) vs.

students who feel rather strongly that US students would think of a lecturer as strange and unusual (n=99). The p-value here is 0.001122 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.232

Students who think US uni students would not be surprised by a lecturer (n=238) vs.

students who think US uni students would regard a lecturer as strange or unusual (n=230). The p-value here is 0.0001598 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.175

Students who are fairly confident they can write a 10 page paper in English (n=75) vs.

students who strongly feel they can't write a 10 page paper (n=110). The p-value here is 0.009214 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.191

Strong opinions only (the top and bottom quartiles) of reactions to a set of items with a combined score indicating a student's willingness to communicate. Higher WtC (n=142) vs.

lower WtC (n=121). The p-value here is 0.004913 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.173
