

I think US university students would regard a teacher who primarily teaches using lectures as...

unnatural/strange. | normal (not strange).

Students who disagree here think "American university students would think a teacher who teaches primarily using lectures is unnatural or strange."

Students who rather strongly think that US profs make use of texts (n=87) vs.

students who rather strongly think US profs overseas AVOID the use of texts (n=70). The p-value here is 0.003407 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.234

Students who think that US teachers in US universities USE texts rather than avoid them (n=265) vs.

those that think US profs "avoid" the use of texts (n=203). The p-value here is 0.0001598 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.175

Students who think informal debate is a common activity in US uni classes (n=370) vs.

students who think informal debate is not a common class activity (n=98). The p-value here is 3.67E-005 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.191

Students who think small group work is a common part of US uni classes (n=353) vs.

students who think small group work is not a common part of US uni classes (n=115). The p-value here is 0.0001684 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.174

Students who think office hour visits are common in US uni (n=395) vs.

students who do not think office hour visits are common (n=73). The p-value here is 0.0004061 and the phi-coefficient/Cramer's V is: 0.163
